Each year, a few weeks before Christmas, we have a service where we deliberately give thanks for those we have lost and pray for 'the peace which passes all understanding' for each one left behind.

beginning of such peace and so is the Holy Spirit's calling to find the meaningful activities he wants us to be doing.

Then life, once again can have relationships and activities that bring anticipation and fulfilment.
