SPOTLIGHT ON MICHAEL FIGUEIRA -ASSISTANT MINISTER

What do you enjoy about being a Minister?



I love people and I find people fascinating. The best part of my job is being able to meet with others and to see God's work in their lives. I enjoy seeing lives renewed and transformed by God's grace in the power of the

gospel. As someone who became a Christian in my early 20's, I remember clearly that transformation in my own life. I love seeing people who were spiritually blind and dead in their sin encounter the light and life of the world – Jesus Christ. It is the most wonderful thing to see in the life of any individual, as they are brought back into a relationship with the one who created them, loves them, and saves them.

What are your plans for your ministry at St Mark's?

There are several responsibilities that I will be

overseeing at St Mark's including the 5:30pm congregation, weddings and baptisms, integration of newcomers as well as outreach. The Scriptures remind us that the gospel is the power of God for salvation (Rom 1:16). My plan is to have an intentional way that people can have a warm and welcoming space where they can explore the gospel deeply. In our secular age, many of the basic themes of the gospel message such as God, sin, grace, love and resurrection need unpacking so people can truly understand the gospel and encounter Christ.

This year I plan to get our evangelistic courses up and running alternating between Alpha and Simply Christianity. By alternating our courses, we seek to give people the continued opportunity to explore the gospel in a follow-on course. Under God, my prayer is that many people will be saved through these courses and that St Mark's continues to hold out the hope of Jesus to its community. Being involved in other outreach events such as Musictime, the St Mark's Lecture and Marriage Course, are other ways to connect with people in a way which is relevant to them.

What are some of the things you have found most encouraging about St. Mark's in the short time you have been here?

My family and I have been so warmly welcomed by the people of St Mark's. We are looking forward to settling in and getting to know more of our church family.


