**FROM THE RECTOR -  
Rev Dr MICHAEL JENSEN**



As we emerge from what will become known as 'the COVID years', we have had many reminders of God's kindness to us at St Mark's. Not the least, this has been because of your kind partnership and prayers.

We have been able to maintain our ministry just when it was needed most. Indeed, in 2022 we've been able to appoint Rev Michael Figueira as our new Assistant Minister with particular responsibility for outreach. And God is blessing his ministry! I am pleased to say that we've seen people join our church community and come to Christ in the first quarter of the year through the Alpha course.

Recently, St Mark's participated in the National Church Life Survey which revealed some interesting things about our church. What we've seen in particular is an increase in the number of people who say they read the Bible and pray daily or on most days. I am rejoicing at this, because it is a sign of growing spiritual maturity and engagement. We've also seen a growing number of our members serving at St Mark's and using their gifts. I was also deeply encouraged to see that, under Rev Tim Escott, our Youth Group is now producing home grown leaders - leaders who have come through our Kids' Church and Youth programmes and now want to serve Christ by leading other young people.

We've also been welcoming a number of new families - which is a testimony to how well Kids' Church is going under Steph Leung's leadership. Things have been difficult for families under COVID, which has meant you are never quite sure who will be there on any given Sunday! But it is delightful to feel the 'buzz' around our ministry to children on a Sunday morning.

It's your help which, under God, has made this possible. But there is so much more still to do and so many opportunities. We've been reminded how vital Christian community is during the period of enforced separation and confusion. We've seen the spiritual hunger in people in our community. ## ARCHBISHOP VISIT

On 10 July, St Mark's has the great honour of hosting our Archbishop, Most Rev Kanishka Raffel. Kanishka will be preaching at each of our services on that day. Kanishka, who was elected to the role of Archbishop in 2021, is our first Archbishop of non-European descent. Born in England to Sri Lankan parents, Kanishka came to Australia as a boy. He became a Christian at university when he read



the Gospel of John. After studying law, he entered the ministry and has served in Canberra and in Perth before becoming the Dean of Sydney in 2016. Kanishka is a warm-hearted follower of Jesus Christ and known for the depth

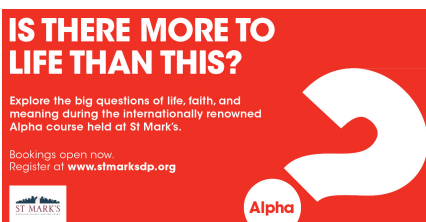
and the insight of his preaching.

## EXPLORE COURSES: ALPHA AND SIMPLY CHRISTIANITY

In Term 1 we ran the Alpha course, which explores the big questions of life, meaning and the Christian faith. Over the six weeks of the course, we had 15 guests join us. The relaxed

nature of the course and dinner helped participants to share openly. The video



content and discussion facilitators were all fantastic in guiding people along their journey. One of the participants related: "My relationship with God is closer. Our family now have started together reading the Bible and praying together daily. I have my trust in Jesus. This has been a life changing course for me and for my family. We're blessed to be part of

the St Mark's community." Another group member was able to honestly share: "I have a relationship with God but still need more help in prayer."

What a joy it has been leading the course. I am very grateful for the team that helped make it happen including Michael, Sarah, Megan, Rhys, Jen, Richard, Janine and Judy.



Currently we are running the Simply Christianity course. This course takes a guided tour and reading of the entire Gospel of Luke. Participants have really enjoyed the interactive nature and the opportunity to read and understand the Bible for themselves.

## ORGAN RECITAL DELIGHTS

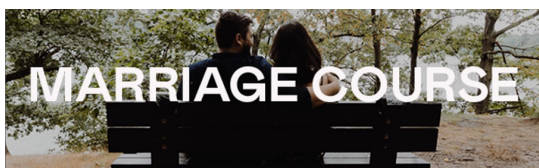
