#### **MORE LIKE CHRIST**

"So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." (Colossians 2:6–7). Behind this central exhortation in the Apostle Paul's letter lies this basic axiom: growth as a Christian means standing firm on the foundation of Christ and his gospel and living it out in every part of your life. This year we are seeking as a church to grow more like Christ.

#### **Gospel and Life Course**

I have been running a course on just this theme: growing in our understanding of the



gospel and how it shapes all of our lives. Our 13 participants were reminded of the fundamental truths of the gospel through key biblical

texts, and we shared ways in which we can respond to what God has done for us. We were encouraged in heart and united more deeply in love and the truth about Christ:

- The gospel is that Jesus is the Lord. So we are called to trust and worship him.
- The gospel is that Christ died and rose to save us. This leads us to rely on him for salvation and live self-giving cross-shaped lives, reflecting the new resurrection life we now have in him.
- The gospel is that we are saved: sinners declared righteous, the holy made holy, alienated people brought into a new humanity by God. So, we live righteous and holy lives, loving and serving one another in unity, and reaching out to our lost world.
