ST MARK'S CONFERENCE: LOVE IN ACTION

The recent annual St Mark's Conference marked a significant step in our church's journey towards becoming more like Christ. By grasping the gospel, listening to God's word, praying together, and living out our faith in community, we witness God working within us through the power of His Spirit.

The theme of this year's conference was Love in Action, with guest speaker Rev Dr Rowan Kemp leading us through foundational teachings from Ephesians. He encouraged us to reflect deeply on the love and forgiveness we have in Christ and how these truths should shape every aspect of our lives.

We focused first on Christ's immeasurable love, a love that surpasses all understanding. We were challenged to pray Ephesians 3:16-21 not only for ourselves but for the entire church, asking God to help us know the immeasurable love he has for us so that we may walk in love as Christ did - sacrificially and wholeheartedly. This call to love others deeply resonated with many attendees, with one participant sharing, "The talks were exceptional, and I left feeling renewed in my commitment to love others more like Christ."

In the second session, Rowan explored the theme of forgiveness. He reminded us that because we have received peace and forgiveness through Christ, we are empowered to extend that same grace to others. The discussions that followed were rich and insightful, with one attendee commenting, "It was so helpful to hear others' views, and the questions really helped us get to know one another." Another participant shared: "Rowan spoke about forgiveness and regret and encouraged us to try to avoid holding onto resentments and bitterness and offered practical advice on how Christians could handle disputes in a godly way." This session led many to see forgiveness as a vital mark of

the Christian life.

The afternoon workshops, led by David Crain, Brian Leung, Alicia Watson, and Diane Speed, helped us put love into action practically. Many appreciated the opportunity to connect with new people, fostering a deeper sense of community. As one participant remarked, "It was great to be in discussions with people I wouldn't normally speak to." Another participant shared: "There were wonderful opportunities to communicate with each other and have good friendship-forming discussions throughout the day."

We are deeply grateful to the entire conference team and everyone who contributed to making this year's event so special. As we continue on this journey of spiritual growth, may we strive to love and forgive like Christ, growing together as His disciples.

SAFETY FIRST!

"It is wonderful to see the paving of the southern side of the church progressing so well



at last," Alicia
Watson writes.
"Many years ago,
extensive work was
undertaken to
remove the garden
bed, improve
drainage and thus

prevent further rising damp in the southern wall. The cost, in addition to this work, to pave the pathway with stone was prohibitive and so we had to be satisfied with a path of gravel. The gravel served us well for many years but with wash off and movement it had become increasingly unstable to walk on and therefore a risk to those using it.

Over the past weeks the old gravel has been removed and is being replaced with sandstone which will complete the paving around the whole church. The paving around the front and north side of the building was replaced or restored following Elton John's wedding when he paid for this work plus the replacement of the wrought iron fence which had been damaged by fans trying to get a glimpse of him at his wedding! At that time there was no agapanthus garden on the front slope and so the fans crowded on it and the fence eventually gave way! The southern side paving has been made possible thanks to a generous gift for which we are very grateful. What a delight both visually and from a safety perspective to have this vital work undertaken."

Di Coates added: "As a member of the 'garden group' who try to keep the gardens, gutters and pathways looking good, neat and tidy, the new paving will be fantastic. The old gravel path was difficult to maintain - when we raked up the leaf droppings a lot of gravel was also raked up, and weeds also grew through the gravel. The water drain was constantly clogged up, which has now been rectified. In general, the new sandstone path is a vast improvement to the church as a whole. Many thanks to the donor for their vision."
