MORE LIKE CHRIST RETREAT

28 members of the St Mark's community gathered at Hartzer Park in Bowral for our annual retreat. Surrounded by beautiful gardens and peaceful natural surroundings, we enjoyed a deeply refreshing time of prayer, worship, reflection, and fellowship. The retreat centred on the theme of **Spiritual Formation**, exploring how we are shaped by God's **Truth**, **Goodness**, and **Beauty**, in **Community**.

Through guided sessions, quiet reflection, and open conversation, we considered how these three qualities draw us deeper into the life of Christ and the life of his people.

Each day included time alone with God, whether in silent walks, journaling, or prayer in the chapel. We gathered for worship and shared meals that nourished both body and



soul. One highlight was an excursion to Bowral to hear our own **Sam Giddy** give an inspiring organ recital - an experience that beautifully embodied the spiritual beauty we

had been reflecting on. Many participants expressed how grateful they were for the space to stop, to listen, and to reconnect with God and one another. The rhythm of community and solitude allowed us to rest in God's presence and be renewed in faith.

We thank God for the retreat and for all who came. It was a reminder that to become more like Christ is not a burden, but a gift - an invitation to live fully in his truth, goodness, and beauty, together.

WELCOME TO SAM GIDDYour new Director of Music

I am delighted to be joining as the Director of Music at St Mark's! I have enjoyed being



involved at St Mark's to varying degrees over the past few years: from my time as the organ scholar from 2016-2018, to returning as a guest organist and accompanist more recently, so I am delighted to be back in a more official

capacity. I remain deeply grateful to my predecessor Dr William Clark not only for his influence on my career as an organist during my time as the organ scholar, but also more recently for encouraging me to consider applying for the Director of Music position.

The core of music at St Mark's is what happens in the service on Sundays, with the choir leading the congregation in singing God's praises and providing appropriate music for worship and reflection during holy communion. St Mark's Choir has a strong foundation of having done this week in and week out for many years. I hope to lead and support the choir to continue doing this with a rich repertoire range sung to the highest possible standard. I also aim to support and train talented young musicians (through our choral and organ scholarship programmes) to further their own musical careers and hone their skills in a valuable ensemble setting. As someone who benefited immensely from being an organ scholar here during my first years of study at The Con, I feel particularly grateful to be able to contribute further to this community.

Since joining St Mark's as the Director of Music, I have been encouraged by members of the choir who not only work hard to achieve high musical standards but are also committed to making the choir a warm and supportive community. The choir remains an excellent avenue to engage with the Christian gospel through the rich and beautiful Anglican tradition. I've also been deeply encouraged by the welcoming and supportive 8am congregation, and the other members of St Mark's ministry team.

My Christian journey has been a slow process of growth and discovery rather than a sudden, dramatic experience! I had the blessing of being taught the gospel since childhood. My understanding of what it means to follow Jesus has grown over the years, through the challenges of life (including moving to Sydney for university in 2016), the wisdom and challenge of Christian community, and the quiet guidance of the Holy Spirit.

I remain greatly indebted to Dr Bill Clark for his influence on my musical career. In addition to being the first person to introduce me to a broad range of Anglican choral repertoire, Bill has subsequently taken a great interest in my career and encouraged me to take steps to grow as a musician. During my organ scholar days, Bill frequently took the time to offer thoughtful, tailored feedback on my liturgical accompaniments – which to a (then) young and inexperienced church musician proved to be foundational.

In my life outside of St Mark's, I also have the privilege of overseeing music ministry at the neighbouring parish of St John's Darlinghurst, as well as working as a freelance organist (including for weekday evensong services at St Andrew's Cathedral), and continuing developing the organ-playing skills which have been the backbone of my musical career. Outside of music, I enjoy cycling, reading, and getting to the beach when I can! My wife, Wayo, works as an architect in Paddington and we live near Rushcutters Bay, so we enjoy exploring all that this area has to offer.

OUTSTANDING RESULT OF ELECTION BBQ
