One of the most precious images the New Testament gives us for the gospel is that of a baton being passed on in a relay race. Paul says to Timothy: "What you have heard from me... entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others also" (2

Timothy 2:2). The Christian faith is never a possession to be hoarded; it is always a gift to be handed on.

Here at St Mark's, we have been given a wonderful opportunity to do just that. Over the coming months, we hope to appoint a new, full-time Children's and Youth Minister. This role is not just another staff position - it is at the very heart of our vision to see the next generation grow up knowing and loving the Lord Jesus. 

In the first half of this year the 5:30pm congregation had the privilege of being the church home of some young naval officers posted to Sydney on a training course. This group attended the first Discover course and




then became the core of a young adult's group, ably discipled and lead by Jack and Claudia. Prior to graduating and receiving their

GROWING SPIRITUALLY AT ST MARK'S

"How do we grow spiritually? How are we transformed by grace?" At St Mark's, we believe the answer to these questions is simple: God transforms us by his Spirit as we grasp the gospel of grace, listen to his Word, respond in prayer, and practise love in community.

Spiritual growth is not about trying harder or doing more; it's about opening ourselves up to the grace of God, and allowing his Spirit to shape us.

But how do we actually live this out in our church family?

That's where our Spiritual Growth Pathway comes in.

Regular Rhythms

Every healthy life has rhythms - like eating, sleeping, or exercising - that keep us alive and well. The same is true of our spiritual life.

- Daily Devotions help us feed on God's Word and pray personally.
- Connect Groups give us a smaller circle of friends to learn with, pray with, and walk alongside
- Sunday Church is our weekly gathering for worship and community, where the gospel is proclaimed and we are reminded that we belong to something bigger than ourselves.

Together, these things give us variety, depth, and balance. And because life is rarely neat, these rhythms flex and adapt across different seasons.

Next Steps

Of course, rhythms alone can feel like maintenance - doing what we've always done. That's why the pathway also invites us to take Next Steps.

- For those exploring Christianity,
 Discover courses give the chance to ask questions and hear the gospel clearly.
- For those wanting to grow in maturity,
 Deepen opportunities courses,
 conferences, and seminars equip us in
 Bible, theology, and Christian living.
- And for those ready to contribute more, Be Deployed encourages us to step into serving, giving, and leadership.

Not every step will be for everyone, and certainly not all at once. But the idea is that there's always another step to take in the direction of knowing Christ more.

Genuine Spiritual Relationships

Finally, this isn't just about activities. What really makes growth possible is genuine spiritual relationships. That means relationships shaped by God's Word, prayer, and love.

We want to be a community where we speak the gospel to one another over coffee, in text messages, and in quiet conversations. Where we pray with each other whenever the opportunity arises. And where we practically love: bearing one another's burdens, forgiving one another, and serving together.

A Clear and Inspiring Path

The great thing about this model is that it's broad enough for anyone to find themselves in it - whether you're just curious about Christianity, a brand-new believer, or someone who's walked with Jesus for decades.

So, as you think about your own place in the St Mark's family this term, ask yourself: What rhythms am I keeping? What next step might God be prompting me to take? And how can I lean into genuine spiritual relationships that point me to Christ?
