Organ Scholarships are also available. The St Mark's Organ Scholarship was founded in 2016. The scholarship was made possible through some kind bequests and donations and also with the help of Musica Viva. The scholarship was established in memory of two St Mark's members. The intent was "to help nourish the fine musicianship that so blesses us, and to honour the gift of the beautiful instrument that sits in our building."

The 8am service is accompanied by our excellent Létourneau organ built in 2004 and donated by the late Lady (Nancy) Fairfax as a memorial to her late husband, Sir Vincent Fairfax.
