THE PRAYER OF PREPARATION

THE EPISTLE

The reader says

The passage appointed for the Epistle is written in Psalms, chapter 1, beginning at the first verse.

¹ Happy are those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or take the path that sinners tread, or sit in the seat of scoffers;
² but their delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law they meditate day and night.
³ They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither.
In all that they do, they prosper. ⁴ The wicked are not so,

but are like chaff that the wind drives away.

- ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous
- ⁶ for the Lord watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

THE CREED

THE PREFACE

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up unto the Lord Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

It is meet and right so to do.

It is very meet, right and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, (Holy Father) almighty, everlasting God. A seasonal preface will follow at Christmas, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost and Trinity.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify your glorious name, evermore praising thee and saying:

THE PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS.

We do not presume to come to thy table, O merciful Lord. trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table. But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy: grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him and he in us. Amen

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death, until his coming again; Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed body and blood:

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread; here the priest is to take the paten and, when he had given thanks, he brake it, here the priest shall break the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat; here the priest is to lay a hand on all the bread this is my body which is given for you: do this in remembrance of me. Likewise, after supper he took the cup;

here the priest is to take the cup and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying Drink ye all of this;

here the priest lays a hand on every vessel with wine to be consecrated for this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins; do this as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me. **Amen**

The body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was given for thee, preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life. Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for thee, and feed on him in thy heart by faith with thanksgiving.

The blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was shed for thee, preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life. Drink this in remembrance that Christ's blood ws shed for thee and be thankful.

When receiving the wine take the cup in both hands from the minister <u>or</u> collect an individual cup from the front pew for which either wine or grapejuice is available. At the communion rail, standing is helpful, especially if kneeling is in any way awkward. Please do not leave the rail until the person after you has finished drinking the wine / grapejuice.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

The priest says Let us pray

Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed by thy name; thy kingdom come thy will be done, in earth as it is in heaven Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

The priest says either the Prayer of Oblation or the Prayer of Thanksgiving. The Prayer of Oblation

O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humby beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and lively sacrifice unto thee; humby beseeching thee, that all we, who are partakers of this holy communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction. And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father almighty, world without end. **Amen**

THE PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Almighty and everlivinig God, we most heartily thank thee, for that thou dost vouchsafe to feed us, who have duly received these holy mysteries, with the spiritual food of the most precious body and blood of thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ; and dost assure us thereby of thy favour and goodness towards us; and that we are very members incorporate in the mystical body of thy Son, which is the blessed company of all faithfull people; and also heirs through hope of thy everlasting kingdom, by the merits of the most precious death and passion of thy dear Son.
